

Statement on the ELV Directive 2000/53/EC of 18 September 2000 on end-of-life vehicles

Ladies and gentlemen,

The ELV Directive on end-of-life vehicles entered into force in September 2000.

This Directive determines measures aimed primarily at the prevention of vehicle waste and, in addition, at the re-use, recycling and other forms of recovery of end-of-life vehicles and their components in order to reduce waste disposal and to improve the environmental performance of all economic operators involved in the life cycle of vehicles and in particular of economic operators directly involved in the treatment of end-of-life vehicles.

We, Ratioplast-Electronics, are aware of the subject and have thoroughly examined any obligations we may have towards our customers.

The ELV Directive 2000/53/EC states that waste should be avoided and that no lead, mercury, cadmium or hexavalent chromium is present.

We comply with the ELV Directive 2000/53/EC and the requirements imposed on us and regularly monitor changes to this Directive.

Within the framework of our business relationship, we will inform you about changes to our delivery products caused by this guideline and coordinate suitable measures with you in individual cases.

With regard to lead, mercury, cadmium or hexavalent chromium, we inform you that these are not included in the products we manufacture.
